Before going on holiday

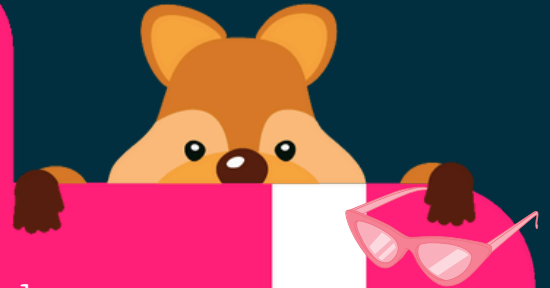
